SSTA to Ballot to cut Teacher Workload

The SSTA Indicative Ballot was to assess the measures proposed by the Government to reduce teacher workload and the assessment required for National Qualifications. The ballot clearly showed that members are unhappy with the current proposals with 91% of respondents prepared to take industrial action short of strike action with 64% prepared to take strike action if necessary.

The SSTA met the new Cabinet Secretary John Swinney on 7 June 2016 and he was urged to intervene with the employers and reach a way forward to tackle the excessive teacher workload created by National Qualifications. The Cabinet Secretary agreed that teachers needed to be focussed on teaching and learning and he said he wanted to remove the 'clutter' that stopped that focus.

The SSTA National Executive met on 16 June and sanctioned a Formal Ballot for Industrial Action at the start of the school year.

SSTA NATIONAL AWARDS AT CONGRESS 2016



The key theme underpinning the relationship between the SSTA and Margaret Smith is one of a consistent dedication to serving the interests and meeting the needs of members.

Margaret was born and educated in Australia and taught in Canada before coming to Scotland.

As many people have done, Margaret started off as a school representative in St Andrew's RC High School in Kirkcaldy - but just as a temporary measure to help out.

Her dedication to members has been absolute ever since - be it advising on the vagaries of conditions or more urgently representing members who have needed support in the face of unfairness, or bullying.

She responded to every approach for help or advice or action immediately and with determination - always going above and beyond.

As she rose to the highest office in the SSTA, she continued this support.

As Convener and then District Secretary in Fife, there are few members who did not either directly, or by reputation, come to know Margaret as a trusted source of support, advice and often a source of hope.

It is down to Margaret's leadership and devotion that many of the currently active school reps and district

officials were first motivated to become involved.

Margaret served as a member of the General Teaching Council for Scotland over many years, convening the

Chartered Teacher Panel and warning of the dangers to the Chartered Teacher Scheme of initial reform, and then eventual abolition.

Latterly as Vice-President then President she carried out many difficult tasks with great care and attention the type of which has characterised her whole career.

Alan McKenzie joined the SSTA in 1986. Alan came to work in Inverclyde in the early nineties taking up the post of Principal Teacher of history at Greenock Academy, where he stayed for the rest of his teaching career. The staff were extremely lucky to have Alan as their school rep and SSTA membership quickly grew when it became obvious that his knowledge of conditions of service was second to none. He worked tirelessly on behalf of his members in the whole of Renfrew Area.

He took over the job of district Secretary when the post became vacant due to retirement and quickly showed the Local Authority that his knowledge and understanding of the Scottish education system was far greater than anyone employed by the Council.

Between 2001 and 2003, Alan became Vice President. In that time, teachers were served greatly by him through many difficult years of contractual changes brought about by the McCrone agreement. In Inverclyde LNCT negotiations he skilfully secured the highest number of promoted posts of any area in Scotland.

In 2003 Alan became President a role that suited his outgoing and direct manner.

We were proud to nominate him first for vice-president and then President of the union, we had an articulate and decisive leader at the helm. His forthright manner showed government officials that the SSTA was a union with a clear vision for Scottish education and it would fight to provide the best conditions for our teachers in schools across the country.

When Alan retired from teaching in 2007, he used his vast experience to work as a professional officer in head office in Edinburgh and then to be appointed as Depute General Secretary. This experience was to prove essential when he was required to step up and be acting General Secretary at a time of huge changes in the curriculum, exam system and more changes in teachers' conditions of service. We are grateful to have had Alan to guide us through these stressful times and lay the foundations for the future work of the SSTA.

Presently, Alan is advising and contributing towards a new constitution for the Association. This shows the continuous commitment Alan has shown towards the SSTA even after retiring from office.
