Home Economics is disappearing from Secondary Schools

SSTA Rep Survey

93% of Secondary School have Home Economics on the school timetable – 7% of schools do not offer Home Economics at all

Time allocated to HE in secondary schools per week (S1 -S3)

- S1 9% no time allocated, 45% one hour, 44% two hours, 6% more than 2 hours
- S2 7% no time allocated, 44% one hour, 41% two hours, 7% more than 2 hours
- S3 9% no time allocated, 6% one hour, 24% two hours, 6% more than 2 hours

Time allocated to HE in secondary schools (S4-S6) qualification courses

- S4 2% one hour, 2% two hours, 29% three hours, 67% more than 3 hours
- S5 1% one hour, 3% two hours, 10% three hours, 87% more than 3 hours
- S6 2% one hour, 2% two hours, 10% three hours, 87% more than 3 hours

Number of Home Economics Teachers

- 16% of schools 1 HE teacher
- 39% of schools 2 HE teachers
- 21% of schools 3 HE teachers
- 17% of schools 4 HE teachers
- 6% of schools more than 4 HE teachers

Reduction in Home Economics teachers in the last three years

• 37% of schools have reduced the number of HE teachers

Schools that provide HE teachers with technician/auxiliary support

- 57% have support
- 43% no support

Amount of technician/auxiliary support per week

- Half day (0.1 FTE)- 16%
- One day (0.2 FTE) 6%
- (0.3) 13%
- (0.4) 13%
- (0.5) 16%
- (0.6) − 4%
- (0.7) − 0%
- (0.8) 6%
- (0.9) 3%
- (1.0) 24%

Reduction in technician/auxiliary support in the last three years

• 31% of schools have reduced in last three years

Formal training for technician/auxiliary support

- 11% have received formal training
- 65% have received no formal training
